

|          | The number of patients being referred have been steadily increasing over time and using this pathway, in most cases, has resulted in the patient not needing to go to Minor Injuries (MIU) or the Emergency Department (ED).  |
|          | Below are just some examples of patients who have been referred and have been managed successfully through the FNC.  Example 1  |
|          | Patient presented at community pharmacy at 10am with swollen infected elbow joint.  The community pharmacist referred them to the FNC, and the patient was given a virtual appointment for 11am that morning. After the virtual consultation the patient was referred to the OPAT (Out-patient Antiobiotic Therapy) Service and started i.v. antibiotic treatment that afternoon. |
|          | Example 2 21-year-old. Ear pain? bleeding, no injury. Assessed by FNC, reassurance given. The patient did not require to visit ED and was advised to speak to their GP if not settling.   |
|          | Example 3 22-year-old chemical burn to scalp. Thet were given an appointment for MIU and managed there with no further review.  |
|          | Example 4 9-year-old with burn to hand. Brought to Emergency Dept for assessment.   |
|          | So please consider a referral to the FNC if you have a suitable patient (e.g. minor injuries, bites, skin infections etc but not medically unwell) rather than referring to their GP or NHS 24.   |





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
