

Freestyle Libre 3 Prescribing April 2024	 Freestyle Libre 3 is a form of real-time continuous glucose monitoring with additional functionality that enables it to communicate directly with certain types of insulin pump. The trio of pump, installed software, and Freestyle Libre 3 is known as a hybrid closed loop (HCL) which provides semi-automated insulin delivery for people with type 1 diabetes. Freestyle Libre 3 is a novel device and is not interchangeable with Freestyle Libre2 Freestyle Libre 3 has been added to Part 3 of Scottish drug tariff from January 2024

Why?					
Atos have advised us that an ESSENTIAL upgrade to the NHSS network infrastructure is being performed at the Livingston data center that will replace the internal firewalls with updated hardware.					
Although the NHSS environment will be fully operational, there will be no traffic coming into and out of the Data Centre during the two hour change window on the 18 th May.					
However, to minimise the impact to ECS, Atos will be using a DR (Disaster Recovery) fail-over to a backup site to allow the ECS service to be maintained – Note though that due to the two hour outage, there may be a delay in updates to ECS as the system clears backlogs of files waiting to upload once reconnected.					
DR as a tool is only used rarely and mainly for emergencies, and hasn't been tested yet on the recently tech-refreshed equipment, so there will also be a <i>pre-test</i> done between 8th and 9th May , as noted above.

REMINDER	Availability of Creon Capsules
	For those community pharmacies who have patients on Creon you will be aware of the extremely sporadic nature of stock availability at the present moment. There is no SSP or MSAN in place at the moment which outlines what pharmacy teams should be doing in light of this, as "technically" there is stock available.
	However, to help and support the supply of what is an extremely important medicine for our cystic fibrosis and pancreatic cancer patients, we are asking you to be considerate to the quantity of medicine that is supplied to each patient when a prescription is presented in order to try and spread the availability across many rather than a fulfilled quantity to fewer patients.

EWS - All HSCPS - May 2024.pdf	Please note: There have been changes to a number of pharmacies telephone numbers and positions within the Early Warning System since the last report in February 2024.
	I would be grateful if you could identify your pharmacy and print off the relevant cascade.
	I would like to reiterate the importance of all pharmacy staff, including Locums, knowing and understanding the cascade process and what they will need to do in response to a message. It may therefore be helpful to site this document close to your main telephone.
	As a reminder, this cascade system can be started by either a Board Officer or any Community Pharmacist. Anyone initiating the system should telephone the 'Master Station' clearly relaying the message that is required for circulation. The 'Master Station' will start the cascade of calls by telephoning the next pharmacy on the list, who will in turn, telephone the next pharmacy and so forth until the last pharmacy calls the 'Master Station'. When the 'Master Station' receives the call from the last pharmacy in the cascade, it should contact the person who initiated the cascade thus completing the cycle.

EWS - All HSCPS - May 2024.pdf	It is essential that pharmacies follow this cascade in the specified order to ensure that all pharmacies receive the message and that the communication is successfully exchanged throughout each HSCP System. Closed pharmacies should be by-passed however; it would be helpful to telephone them with the message once they re-open. In these instances, please advise us that you have already passed on the message to the pharmacy they were expected to contact, which will stop unnecessary calls.

ACTION	CP Referrals to Flow Navigation Centre
	As you will be aware all Community Pharmacists are able to directly refer suitable patients to GGC's Flow Navigation Centre (FNC) – see <u>here</u> for more information.
	The number of patients being referred have been steadily increasing over time and using this pathway, in most cases, has resulted in the patient not needing to go to Minor Injuries (MIU) or the Emergency Department (ED).
	Below are just some examples of patients who have been referred and have been managed successfully through the FNC. Example 1
	Patient presented at community pharmacy at 10am with swollen infected elbow joint. The community pharmacist referred them to the FNC, and the patient was given a virtual appointment for 11am that morning. After the virtual consultation the patient was referred to the OPAT (Out-patient Antiobiotic Therapy) Service and started i.v. antibiotic treatment that afternoon.
	Example 2 21-year-old. Ear pain? bleeding, no injury. Assessed by FNC, reassurance given. The patient did not require to visit ED and was advised to speak to their GP if not settling.
	Example 3 22-year-old chemical burn to scalp. Thet were given an appointment for MIU and managed there with no further review.
	Example 4 9-year-old with burn to hand. Brought to Emergency Dept for assessment.
	So please consider a referral to the FNC if you have a suitable patient (e.g. minor injuries, bites, skin infections etc but not medically unwell) rather than referring to their GP or NHS 24.

Lack of clinical evidence of effectiveness means they cannot support the continued inclusion of these products as treatments available on the NHS, in line with prescribing guidance across the country.
