ACTION	Pharmacy First correct way of working
	As you will all be aware NHS Pharmacy First Scotland (PFS) allows community pharmacists to provide expert advice, treatment or referral to another healthcare professional, for conditions such as sore throats, ear ache and cold sores. In addition, for a limited range of common clinical conditions such as urinary tract infections (UTIs) and shingles via PGD.
	All NHS PFS consultations should be in response to symptoms , with a discussion between the patient and the pharmacy team member before any action is taken. What it is not, is a service where patients are supplied with a medication following their specific request.
	The service should be carried out and delivered in line with the guidance and flow chart that CPS have shared on their website. The information can be accessed via the following link:- NHS Pharmacy First Scotland Service Community Pharmacy Scotland (cps.scot)
	The NHS is under extreme financial pressures, so we have to ensure that all supplies of medicines are made under the appropriate conditions of service delivery to minimise any additional costs that would not normally be incurred i.e. where a patient would normally buy a medicinal product.

	The Freestyle Libre 2 and Dexcom One monitoring systems are being discontinued, patients currently using these systems will be transitioned to Freestyle Libre 2 Plus or Dexcom One+
	Specialist Diabetes teams and Primary Care teams will facilitate changes to repeat prescriptions and offer support to patients if needed when they change product.
	Freestyle Libre 2 Plus
	The Freestyle Libre 2 sensor is being discontinued and replaced with Freestyle Libre 2 Plus . Freestyle Libre 2 Plus sensors have a slightly longer wear time (15 days compared to 14 days) and have compatibility with some insulin pumps.

The FreeStyle Libre 2 Plus sensor works with the existing FreeStyle LibreLink app4 and the FreeStyle Libre 2 reader. Patients do not need to update the app or change their reader. Freestyle Libre 2 Plus is not interchangeable with Freestyle Libre 3. Freestyle Libre 3 is only compatible with specific insulin pumps.

Dexcom One+

The Dexcom One+ sensor is an all-in-one sensor and transmitter. Each sensor has a 10-day lifespan. Dexcom One+ sensors are smaller than the original Dexcom One sensor plus transmitter set up and have a faster warm up time of 30 mins once the patient has applied a new sensor.

If a patient transitions from Dexcom One to Dexcom One+ and uses a receiver to access their readings rather than a smart device, they will need to request a new receiver from the company.

Dexcom One sensors are not interchangeable with Dexcom One+ sensors

	A MS form has been developed and teams in community and acute can use this to refer patients who fit the criteria. The MS form is automatically directed to the pharmacy hub in the HSCP linked to the patients GP practice.
	Polypharmacy Review
	A 7 step polypharmacy review is carried out by the practice pharmacist within 4 weeks. The referrer will receive feedback once the review has been completed
	How to refer
	Please consider referring patients you think would benefit from a polypharmacy review, the MS form only take a minute or two to complete (link in the attached poster) .It is important you enter the correct CHI number and GP practice code when making the referral.

	Please give consideration to this in relation to stock holding and give consideration to running stock of Prograf down as new requests for Adoport increase.
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

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

Be#GloveAware

- Disposable non-sterile gloves have been the most procured personal protective equipment (PPE) items since the start of the pandemic.
- Gloves are single use items that can't be recycled.

Disposable non-sterile gloves play a vital role in healthcare – when used correctly they protect staff and patients from potential infection

- Where there's a risk of exposure to blood, body fluids, broken skin and hazardous drugs and chemicals.
- Remove gloves after caring for a patient.
- Do not wear the same pair of gloves for the care of more than one patient

However, over-use or inappropriate use of gloves has infection control implications as well as an environmental impact.

They <u>are not needed</u> when touching a patient if there's no risk of contact with body fluids, for example:

- giving vaccinations and clinical observations like blood pressures
- · comforting patients, or helping patients eat or drink
- pushing a chair or trolley, or helping patients to mobilise
- doing administrative tasks like using a computer or phone

By minimising unnecessary glove use, we can reduce waste, cut our impact on the planet, and save money that can be reinvested back into patient care.

Be Greener Aware, Be Glove Aware.



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
