

	New Varenicline PGD – Error with proposed date for signing.
	Correction - In the launch information for the new PGD for varenicline, in this newsletter last week, the date for signing the PGD and the electronic submission was incorrect. It should have been the 7 th May 2025 (not 7 th July). Apologies!
	Please aim to have the new PGD signed and submitted to enable prescribing of varenicline within the PHS Pharmacy smoking cessation service by 7 th May.

Mobile Service West Dunbartonshi	Our partners at the Scottish Ambulance Service are 'touring' Greater Glasgow and Clyde in the mobile vaccination units. This service



ACTION Care Home eMARS We have been made aware of a care home within NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde that has recently adopted an eMARS system. Prior to the system going live, they requested new prescriptions for all medicines out with the usual ordering cycle. They were under the impression they should return all residents' medication to the pharmacy and then reorder the same medication before moving to eMARS. The eMARS supplier confirmed that they do not advise to send any medications which are still in use by the resident back to the pharmacy, as the system has the capability to add stock. They advised that as part of the implementation process, they provide a list of tasks that the home can complete, and one task mentioned is to audit their medication not in use. The aim of this is to prompt a medication review on unnecessary medications and reduce the need to order medicines not being used, causing less waste in the long run. We would recommend that if any similar requests are made to order prescriptions or receive returns, care homes are directed to the eMARS provider for further support and guidance. Jennifer Allardyce

ACTION	Utilisation of GP10a
	We have been made aware of inappropriate use of Stock Order Forms (GP10a) within Community Pharmacies. We are currently unsure of how big the problem may be, however wanted to flag this to everyone as early as possible to ensure that Pharmacy teams were not inadvertently supplying in an inappropriate manner.
	Only items that are actually supplied to the GP Practice should be annotated on a GP10a form. If any non-listed items are supplied but recorded as an allowed product, to ensure that a payment is realised, then this would be considered fraudulent activity and, as such could be investigated by Counter Fraud Services (CFS). Items should only be added to a GP10a form by a member of the GP practice team.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Asthma Management Guidelines
	NHS GG&C have recently updated their Asthma Management Guidelines for Adults. The major change is the shift to using combination inhalers, either as a reliever alone (AIR Anti-Inflammatory Reliever), or as both a reliever and preventer (MART Maintenance and Reliever Therapy) and no longer starting patients on a separate reliever device.
	Over the coming months community pharmacies will start seeing more prescriptions for budesonide / formoterol combination inhalers with Fobumix® Easyhaler®, Symbicort® Turbohaler® and DuoResp® Spiromax® being the preferred NHS GG&C brands. This will initially be with newly diagnosed asthma patients or existing asthma patients who are poorly controlled or presenting with symptoms. Existing asthma patients who are well controlled will likely stay on their current therapy.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Compliance Aid/Mds – Freight/Carriage Costs:
	I am pleased to let the community pharmacy network know that NHS GGC will reimburse freight costs associated with the purchase of MDS trays from 1 st April 2025.
	There is no need to make a formal claim for this. The CPD Team will make payment automatically where this charge appears on the supporting invoice.
	A payment of £9.95 will be available for contractors ordering from Omnicell and £10.00 for contractors ordering from Venalink, when a charge appears on the supporting invoice.
	N.B. Please do not amend the rates appearing in the ECW – these are the prevailing rates agreed for the MDS service and they cannot be changed without negotiation and

agreement. Amending rates will not result in further reimbursement.

Controlled Drug Governance Team, NHSGGC

Controlled Drug Destruction – Requesting Attendance of an Authorised Witness Schedule 2 Controlled Drug stock that has expired or is no longer required must only be destroyed in the presence of an Authorised Witness. Community Pharmacists requiring witnessed destruction of Schedule 2 Controlled Drug stock can now request a visit from an Authorised Witness using an electronic form. The new electronic form can be accessed via the link below:

In advance of the visit, Community Pharmacists should:

- Ensure that all items are recorded in an appropriate CD register
- Check that balances are correct
- Ensure there are no unresolved discrepancies
- Ensure that there are sufficient kits for the volume of CDs requiring destruction
- Have a member of staff available for the duration of the appointment
- To save time during the visit, please complete the Controlled Drugs Destruction Form which will be required during the visit for signing off by the Authorised Witness


Note – There is no legal requirement for pharmacy stock of Schedule 3, 4 and 5 CDs or for patient-returned CDs to be destroyed in the presence of an Authorised Witness; the destruction of these must be recorded and signed for in the back of the private prescription book (agreed by the GPhC Inspector). The CD Governance Team will accept requests on the old Excel version of the form until mid-May, after which we would ask community pharmacy colleagues to only use the electronic form to request visits. Please put all quit attempts on PCR and record weekly to ensure payment for the service is received.

Medicine Supply Alert Notice - Various Products - MSAN(2025)14, MSAN(2025)15 and MSAN(2025)16 - 11 April 2025

Please find attached three level 2 MSANs advising of supply issues with several strengths of estradiol (Estradot®) patches; diltiazem (Angitil® SR) 90 mg modified-release capsules; and the discontinuation of triamcinolone acetonide 10mg/ml (Adcortyl® ampoules) and 40mg/ml (Kenalog® vials) suspension for injection.

- MSAN(2025)14 Estradiol (Estradot®) 25 micrograms/24 hours, 37.5 micrograms/24 hours, 50 micrograms/24 hours, 75 micrograms/24 hours, and 100 micrograms/24 hours transdermal patches Update
- MSAN(2025)15 Diltiazem (Angitil® SR) 90 mg modified-release capsules
- MSAN(2025)16 Triamcinolone acetonide 10mg/ml (Adcortyl® ampoules) and 40mg/ml (Kenalog® vials) suspension for injection

IMPORTANT INFORMATION	Electronic Claiming Workbook (ECW)
	Thank you to those contractors who have submitted their monthly claims for local services using the updated version of the ECW (V3.1).
	From feedback received we would ask you to note the following:

<u>MCA:</u> - We are aware that the rates appearing on the ECW are different from the current rates for Venalink and Omnicell products – **Please do not change these rates on the spreadsheet** – the rates that appear on the spreadsheet are the agreed rates for this service. These cannot be changed without negotiation between NHSGGC and CPGGC.

<u>Drop Down Lists:</u> We have been made aware that a few contractors are unable to see the drop down lists on the spreadsheet. While drop down lists have been a feature in Excel since Version 2 if you cannot see these you may need to consider upgrading your Microsoft package.

<u>Cover Sheet:</u> It is imperative that all fields coloured grey on the cover sheet are completed. The CPD Team will return claims unprocessed where a claim is submitted with key information missing i.e. date of submission, name of person submitting workbook. This information is a requirement under the Board's Standing Financial Instructions.
