

Key Facts for NHS Flu GG&C Flu Season 2024/25

Full Update: October 2024

Q – When will the service run?

The service will run from 1st October 2024 – 31st March 2025 (inclusive), in parallel with other providers.

Q – Who can I vaccinate under the service?

Any eligible patient can have their vaccination administered via Community Pharmacy.

Community Pharmacy should focus on patients in the following cohorts:

- All those aged 65 and over;
- All those aged 18 to under 65 in defined risk groups. This includes:
- Those in clinical at risk groups set out in Green Book Chapter 19;
- Those experiencing homelessness;
- Those experiencing substance misuse;
- Asylum Seekers living in Home Office hotel or B&B accommodation;
- Pregnant women.

Q – Where can I vaccinate patients?

Under this service vaccinations will be administered either within, or out with pharmacy premises, in a suitable private area which must comply with the minimum requirements set out within the SLA.

Q – *Can I vaccinate Care Home Staff in the Care Home?*

Yes – this is solely at the discretion of the Participant and by arrangement with the individual Care Home. A list of



participating pharmacies willing to undertake the service within the Care Home setting has been provided to the Care Home Group and participating pharmacies may be approached.

There is no additional payment for administering vaccinations in the Care Home setting.

Q – Which categories of patient are NOT eligible for the service?

- Children under the age of 18#;
- The well 50 64 years olds;
- Teachers; and
- Prison staff

The Childhood Team will be offering a flu mop up service week beginning 16th December for those who missed their nasal flu due to absence from school. In addition they will also go back into schools for further mop ups after Christmas. Local Teams can be contacted if parents particularly want their child to receive nasal flu before Christmas. Contact Details for the Teams are provided at the end of this document.

Q – Can I vaccinate a SCW (Social Care Worker) who lives in another Health Board area, but works in GGC?

Access to the service for SCWs is predicated on where the person is employed. So all SCWs who are employed in GGC are eligible for the service, regardless of where they live.

Q – I have been approached by a patient who isn't 60 until February 2025 – can I vaccinate them?

Participants can vaccinate any patient who will attain the age of 60 on or before 31st March 2025.

Q – What is the position with vaccines?

Stock will be available to order via Movianto's Marketplace portal from week beginning Monday 16th September 2024.

Each pharmacy has been allocated:



QIVc

 4 x packs of QIVc for the entire duration of the programme; and

aQIV

- 2 x packs of aQIV for the entire duration of the programme.

Q – What if I need more vaccines?

In the unlikely event that a participating pharmacy needs to order more than this allocation, a request should be made to cpdt@ggc.scot.nhs.uk

The request should contain:

- Contractor Code;
- Amount and type of stock required; and
- Reason for request.

Q – Can I vaccinate Pharmacy staff members?

The vaccination of community pharmacy staff is included in the eligible cohorts as frontline health and social care workers.


Q – *Can I vaccinate a patient that has already been vaccinated by their GP or who already has an appointment to be seen by their GP?*

Patients must not have received a flu vaccine already or have made an appointment with another provider.

Q – I have a patient who has a letter of appointment for a COVID vaccination. Will this be affected if I "tick" No to the appointment question in the VMT?

There is a known national issue within the VMT where ticking No to the clinic question (see below):







- Participation/Training Grant (if applicable);
- Vaccination Payment.

Participation/Training Grant: £350.00 (only for those contractors who have not previously been paid the full grant); Training/Grant: £150.00 (for those contractors who have already previously been paid the full grant); Vaccination Payment: £8.75 per vaccination.

Q – Can I advertise the service?

All participants have been provided with an updated poster which can be displayed in the pharmacy.
