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WORKSHOP SESSION 1

WORKSHOP A: ROCKET DRAINS

Kirsty Thorpe, Consultant in Palliative Medicine and Tim Morgan, Lead Consultant Physician Palliative Medicine

This workshop will explore the types of ascites, the related procedures, aftercare, and the management of unexpected complications.

WORKSHOP B: CHILD BEREAVEMENT AWARENESS

Jane Watson, Bereavement Support Worker for Education and Jenny Fowler, Bereavement Support Worker for NHS Grampian

Archie's Child Bereavement Service support children and young people in Grampian, Highlands and Tayside when they have had a bereavement. 1 in 29 children in Scotland will be bereaved of a parent every year. Our service can support these children, but also train professionals across all 3 regions in bereavement awareness. In this workshop, we will cover age and stage appropriate information, language and tools that can help start conversations with children, when they are read

WORKSHOP C: MANAGED PRESCRIBING / MANAGEMENT OF SYRINGE PUMP Donna Ewan, Lead Clinical Nurse Specialist Palliative Care, Hospital Specialist Palliative Care Team

This workshop will focus on the practical aspects of prescribing syringe pumps. Attendees will be familiar with syringe pump prescribing and this workshop will aim to explore aspects of prescribing medicines administered via a syringe pump. It will include discussion around opiate choices, dose conversions, compatibilities and will hopefully allow the attendee to gain further knowledge and confidence when deciding to switch to a syringe pump. There will be opportunities for discussion and questions in relation to syringe pump prescribing.

WORKSHOP D: END OF LIFE CARE WITH DEMENTIA

Kenny Davidson, Specialist Nurse for Dementia (Care Homes), NHS Grampian (Moray)

At this workshop we will be examining how our understanding of dementia directly impacts the quality of care people living with dementia receive. This will be followed by an introduction to Lifeworld theory as a way of understanding dementia and improving related end of life care.

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WORKSHOP SESSION 2

WORKSHOP E: PRACTICAL ADVICE ON SYRINGE PUMPS (PALLIATIVE CARE)

Flora Watson, Macmillan Nurse Consultant for Palliative Care and Nicki Bisset, Clinical Nurse Specialist

This interactive session will focus on how to set up, and run, a syringe pump. Those choosing to attend may not deal with syringe pumps on a regular basis and simply want a refresher along with an opportunity to practice. The session will close with a group discussion on how to problem solve common issues that can arise.

WORKSHOP F: ORAL CARE - BEST PRACTICE

A healthy mouth is important for eating, speaking, socialising and for our physical and mental wellbeing. It is important that we are all equipped with the knowledge, information and confidence to care for the mouths of individuals in our care. In this workshop we will look at the wide range of oral health resources that can make an individuals mouth more comfortable during Palliative and End of life Care.

WORKSHOP G: ADMINISTRATION OF SUBCUTANEOUS MEDICINES BY PATIENTS OR INFORMAL CARERS

This workshop aims to promote awareness and discussion about the NHS Grampian policy supporting administration of subcutaneous medicines by patients or informal carers.
