National Patient Safety Alert: Harm from incorrect recording of a penicillin allergy as a penicillamine allergy

Following a recent <u>NatPSA</u> we are reminding staff of the <u>HEPMA User Alert</u> issued last year which offered guidance on how to avoid the mis-selection of penicillamine for a penicillin allergy and vice versa, and how to review allergy status within HEPMA.

The NatPSA has actions for both Secondary and Primary care, NHS Grampian is already meeting most of the requirements detailed in the NatPSA and working on the remaining requirements.

Shared Learning Summaries: Rivaroxaban

This shared learning summary, relevant to both Primary and Secondary Care aims to highlight the importance of clearly documenting and actioning when a change of dose is required after a set period of time.
