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#### **Quetiapine MR: Limited Stocks**

Supply constraints impacting on all strengths (50mg, 150mg, 200mg, 300mg & 400mg) of modified release quetiapine have been identified.

This is not a stock out situation therefore no proactive switching of patients is recommended. The attached information is intended to support the management of patients should there be a situation where appropriate stocks cannot be procured to ensure continuity of supplies.

This information has been shared within the adult mental health specialist service for awareness should their support be required in managing patients.

#### NHS Grampian Guidance for Prescribing and Dispensing of Stoma Appliances in Primary Care

Please find attached the recently updated NHS Grampian Guideline for the Prescribing and Dispensing of Stoma Appliances in Primary Care. This guideline now contains a stoma accessory formulary, to assist Primary Care and Community Pharmacy when dealing with stoma appliance prescribing requests.

#### Glucagon-like Peptide-1 (GLP-1) Agonists and Oral Contraception

#### **Smoking Cessation Success!**

A shout out to a few pharmacies whose smoking data for Quarter 2, July-Sept 2024, showed excellence with no missed submissions, a high number of sign-ups and a 12-week-quit success rate well above the National average (22.9%):

- BA Christies who had 10 sign-ups, no missed submissions and 4 successful quits, a success rate of 40%.
- Right Medicine Ardach who signed up 11 patients, had no missed submissions and 4 successful quits, a success rate of 36%.
- A final shout out to Tarves who only had 5 sign-ups but 4 of those had successful quits, a whopping success rate of 80%.
