What we mean by 'homeless or temp accommodation': living rough / night shelter/ homeless or temporary accommodation / women's shelter / residential care / supported accommodation / insecure accommodation / threat of eviction / living under threat of violence / temporary or unfit housing / overcrowding / sofa-surfing

What we mean by 'overdosing / blackout on street drugs': loss of consciousness / had Naloxone administered / attended A&E / admitted to hospital / needed an ambulance due to drug use

What we mean by 'involvement with the police': charged, cautioned, prison sentence, Drug Treatment & Testing Order (DTTO), stopped and questioned by police.
