Pharmacies will have 3 official visits (plus any further informal support) from their Public Health Practitioner:

- Initial visit with lead Pharmacist and Public Health Champion(s) to discuss criteria, training package and actions. (approx. 1 hour max)
- Three month visit to discuss progress and highlight actions still required. (approx. 30-45 mins)
- Six month visit to sign off criteria as complete or highlight areas of concern for further work (approx. 30-45 mins)
